The following Act of the Andhra Pradesh Legislature received the assent of the Governor on the 16th February, 2019 and the said assent is hereby first published on the 17th February, 2019 in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette for general information :-

ACT No. 5 of 2019

AN ACT TO AUTHORISE THE APPROPRIATION OF CERTAIN FURTHER MONEYS FROM AND OUT OF THE CONSOLIDATED FUND OF THE STATE OF ANDHRA PRADESH FOR THE SERVICES OF THE FINANCIAL YEAR WHICH COMMENCED, ON THE 1st APRIL, 2018

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Andhra Pradesh in the Seventieth year of the Republic of India as follows:-

Short title.

1. This Act may be called the Andhra Pradesh Appropriation (No.2) Act, 2019.

Authorization of supplementary appropriation of moneys Rs. 37896,62,20,000 from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Andhra Pradesh for the financial year which commenced on the 1st April, 2018.

2. The State Government may appropriate from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Andhra Pradesh, for the financial year which commenced on the 1st April, 2018, a further sum not exceeding thirty seven thousand eight hundred and ninety six crores, sixty two lakhs and twenty thousand rupees, being moneys required to meet, -

(a) the supplementary grants made by the Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly for that year, as set-forth in column (3) of the Schedule; and

(b) the supplementary expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State of Andhra Pradesh for that year, as set forth in column (4) of the Schedule.

Appropriation.

3. The sums authorized to be appropriated from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State by this Act, shall be appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the Schedule in relation to the said year.
