**ANDHRA PRADESH ACTS, ORDINANCES AND

The following Act of the Andhra Pradesh Legislature received the assent of the Governor on the 24<sup>th</sup> December, 2020 and the said assent is hereby first published on the 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2020 in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette for general information :

**ACT No. 45 of 2020.**

AN ACT TO AUTHORISE THE APPROPRIATION OF CERTAIN FURTHER MONEYS FROM AND OUT OF THE CONSOLIDATED FUND OF THE STATE OF ANDHRA PRADESH FOR THE SERVICES OF THE FINANCIAL YEAR WHICH COMMENCED ON THE 1<sup>st</sup> APRIL, 2020.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Andhra Pradesh in the Seventy First Year of the Republic of India as follows:-



Short title.	1. This Act may be called the Andhra Pradesh Appropriation (No.4) Act, 2020.
Authorization of supplementary appropriation of moneys Rs. 18826,72,21,000 from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Andhra Pradesh for the financial year which commenced on the 1 <sup>st</sup> April, 2020	<p>2. The State Government may appropriate from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Andhra Pradesh, for the financial year which commenced on the 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2020, a further sum not exceeding Eighteen thousand eight hundred twenty six crores, seventy two lakhs and twenty one thousand rupees being moneys required to meet, -</p> <p>(a) the supplementary grants made by the Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly for that year, as set-forth in column (3) of the Schedule; and</p> <p>(b) the supplementary expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State of Andhra Pradesh for that year, as set forth in column (4) of the Schedule;</p>
Appropriation.	3. The sums authorized to be appropriated from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Andhra Pradesh by this Act, shall be appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the Schedule in relation to the said year.
